

AMAZE is a global initiative implemented by core partners **Advocates for Youth, ANSWER,** and **YouthTech Health**, in collaboration with organizations around the world, that provides sexuality education to Very Young Adolescents through short, animated videos as well as resources for parents and teachers.

AMAZE's international partner organizations use and disseminate original, dubbed, and adapted versions of AMAZE videos in many ways. Below is a summary of selected examples of how AMAZE partner organizations choose to make AMAZE videos available to the communities that they serve. AMAZE partner organization Reach a Hand Uganda has integrated some of the AMAZE South African adapted videos into their tv educational app, **SAUTIPLUS TV.** AMAZE is included as a series with 33 episodes, which can be accessed by users who register for free for SAUTIPLUS TV.



the Auckland University of Technology (AUT), the University of Otago, and Johns Hopkins University are disseminating AMAZE videos through the **Harmonised App**, a social media forum focused on healthy relationships.



UNESCO Beijing Cluster Office has integrated select Chinese-language AMAZE videos into the **You&Me App.** You&Me is a digital platform for promoting sexuality education, which was first developed in China by MSI and is now managed by a locally registered NGO as a spin-off of MSI's localization. The platform provides school teachers and non-formal educators with free CSE resources, including video-based CSE lesson plans, PowerPoint presentations and demonstration teaching videos. Currently, in partnership with UNESCO, You&Me in upgrading its video-based CSE curriculum, by using selected AMAZE videos to develop new lesson plans or integrating them into existing lesson plans.


