


About YWEN

YWEN promotes the advancement of Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) for young people, emphasizing youth engagement and participation in the fields of health and education. YWEN collaborates closely with government ministries, particularly ministries of Education, Gender and Health in areas such as adolescent and youth health and well-being, development and empowerment. The organization has actively participated and conducted various capacity-building initiatives focusing on adolescent and youth health, Comprehensive Sexuality Education (CSE), early and unintended pregnancy prevention and gender based violence.



Partnership with AMAZE

Objective(s):

- 1. To conduct Comprehensive SRHR training for AGYW in remote and isolated regions of Namibia.
- To strengthen areas of advocacy around the issues affecting AGYW's leadership and sexual and reproductive health rights

Activities:

- 1. Visit youth centers, Sunday schools,s and primary schools for CSE video distribution among AGYW
- 2. Distribute Afrikaans video in Kharas rural to the AGYW out of school.
- 3. Support girls' ambassadors (12) for discussion and train them on leadership, access to services, and improving comprehensive sexuality education (CSE), promoting



Partnership with AMAZE Outcomes:


- 1. Reached out to a total 524 Young people throughout the grant cycle with
- 2. Active peer to peer groups: 12 girls ambassadors
- 3. Supported AGYW with High Viral Load with adherence session and now most are suppressed.
- 4. Openness among AGYW in seeking services
- 5. Through STAR award initiative we formed strong relationship with churches ensuring that young people around church are empowered to access services.



Lessons Learned

- Enhanced HIV/AIDS awareness and understanding among Onambutu Parish participants; clarified misconceptions about PrEP and PEP, dispelling the belief that these medications prevent pregnancy.
- **Gaining Parental Support:** Involving parents and guardians in the education process helps in gaining their support and reducing resistance. Providing information sessions for parents about the content and benefits of the videos is beneficial.
- Community Engagement: Working with community leaders and stakeholders to endorse the program facilitated smoother implementation and acceptance.
- Overcoming Stigma: Tackling the stigma associated with discussing sexual health openly is a challenge that can be mitigated through consistent education and community engagement.
